David Hulchanski's scholarship focuses on local and global trends in housing, poverty and social welfare policy; human rights and social justice issues; and social and community development. His current housing research is focused on homelessness, social and rental housing problems, and the housing experience of immigrants and refugees in Toronto. Two major current research initiatives are: (1) “Housing Experiences of New Canadians: Comparative Case Studies of Immigrants and Refugees in Greater Toronto”; and (2) Homelessness in Canada (local and national trends, politics and solutions). Professor Hulchanski's approach to applied social research is multi-method, including both qualitative and quantitative methods, relying where possible on a participatory research process.
